Market Overview

U.S. equities pulled back in the first quarter as rising trade-related tensions weighed on risk assets. By mid-February, the administration had designated April 2 as the date to unveil a package of reciprocal tariffs, invoking the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) to declare a national emergency. Markets reacted unfavorably after a string of soft economic releases weakened, including declines in consumer sentiment and business surveys. Meanwhile, 1-year inflation swaps climbed 72 basis points to 3.25%. The Federal Reserve held policy rates steady throughout the quarter amid elevated uncertainty. However, fed-funds futures shifted to price in three 25-basis-point rate cuts in 2025, up from two at the start of the year.

Among the eleven S&P MidCap 400® sectors, five posted gains during the third quarter, led by the defensive utilities sector (10.6%). On the other hand, cyclical sectors including information technology (-15.8%) and consumer discretionary (-11.7%) underperformed.

Performance

During the quarter, REGL's benchmark, the S&P MidCap400® Dividend Aristocrats® Index, outperformed the S&P MidCap 400 by 6.8% (0.7% vs. -6.1%). The outperformance can be attributed to both REGL's sector allocation and security selection.

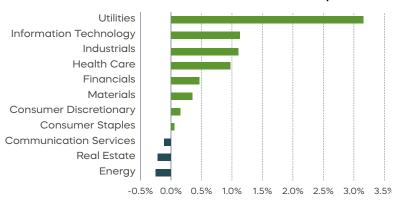

Attribution

In terms of sector allocation, REGL benefited from an overweight in utilities, which was the top performing sector during the quarter. As the second highest sector weight in REGL's portfolio, utilities contributed a positive allocation effect of 2.7%. Additionally, REGL's underweight in information technology and consumer discretionary, the two worst-performing sectors during the quarter, contributed a positive allocation effect of 1.7%. In terms of security selection, REGL's holdings in industrials, health care and utilities all outperformed their sector benchmarks, adding a positive selection effect of 2.4% to relative performance.

From an individual stock perspective, energy service providers National Fuel Gas Company (NFG) and UGI Corp. (UGI) led the gains, as the utilities sector posted strong performance. Both companies also benefited from a rebound in natural gas prices amid colder-than-expected winter weather and strong LNG/LPG export demand. Other top contributors include Royal Gold Inc (RGLD), as gold prices continued their rally from 2024 due to heightened geopolitical tensions. In terms of detractors, shares of powersports vehicles manufacturer Polaris Inc. (PII) and RV manufacturer Thor Industries (THO) fell, based on softer demand and supply chain concerns. Investment banking advisory firm Evercore Inc. (EVR) also saw its stocks retreat after strong performance last year. Despite the company beating revenue and earnings expectations for the latest quarter, concerns for a tepid M&A environment weighed on share performance.

As a group, REGL's holdings generally have had stable earnings, solid fundamentals, and strong histories of profit and growth. This strategy has a demonstrated history of weathering market turbulence over time by capturing most of the gains of rising markets and fewer of the losses in falling markets.
